### Free speech limited with military, government employees

Free speech has its limits when it comes to military and government employees.

Article 88 makes it a crime for any commissioned officers to use contemptuous words against the president, vice president, Congress, secretary of a military department, secretary of transportation, or the governor or legislature of any state disregarding if the statement made is true or not. The First Amendment of the Constitution does not provide for defense of

such an offense. Contemptuous, as used in Article 88, means insulting, rude, disdainful, or otherwise disrespectfully attributing to other qualities of meanness, disreputableness or worthlessness. Article 88 applies to officers.

Article 134, UCMJ applies to enlisted members of the military who use contemptuous language as mentioned above.

Civilian employees of the Department of Air Force can be punished for using contemptuous language towards the president or other officials if comments have a negative impact on the mission of the unit, adverse personnel actions could be taken.

All members of the Wing should exercise common sense and good judgement should they wish to comment on or discuss current events.
