**Operations.** Trained with P-70 fighters for daylight and night air interception, ground controlled interception, navigation and instrument flying. Air echelon arrived in England on 31 Mar 1943 where pilots, engineers, and radar operators trained separately until May

1943 when all elements went to Ayre, Scotland to train as a unit. The ground echelon arrived in North Africa on 11 May 1943 and in June 1943 worked with RAF night fighters. The air and ground echelons joined up in early Jul 1943 at Monastir, Tunisia and entered combat, flying British-made Beaufighters. Flew escort missions for the airborne invasion of Sicily in Jul 1943, patrols and air cover over Anzio beachhead during Jan-Feb 1944 and night patrols during the invasion of Southern France. Following establishment of beachheads, the squadron moved to France and supported the American 7th and French 1<sup>st</sup> Armies continuing to fly patrols, night interceptor and night intruder missions. Squadron was unmanned from Feb-Jul 1946. Upon receiving P-61 and B-25 aircraft, trained in night fighter techniques until moving to Alaska in May 1947. Redesignated as a Special Operations Training Squadron and activated in Jul 1970, replacing the 4413 Combat Crew Training Squadron at Lockbourne AFB, OH. While there provided special operations combat training in AC-119 aircraft. Gained AC-130 aircraft in early 1971 and moved to Hurlburt Fld, FL in Jul 1971 to continue special operations training. Trained in F-117 aircraft beginning in Oct 1989. Supported OPERATION JUST CAUSE in Panama, 19 Dec 1989. Personnel and aircraft deployed to King Khalid AB, Saudi Arabia on 19 Aug 1990 as part of OPERATION DESERT SHIELD; conducted combat missions against Iraq during OPERATION DESERT STORM, 16 Jan-28 Feb 1991. Trained on MC-130J and HC-130J aircraft beginning in September 2011.
