Blazon. On a disc Azure, a stylized Greek hoplite, his body Buff, caped and plumed Gules, helm, wrist guard, cape holder and shield Bronze, detailed and fimbriated Sable, in sinister hand a lightning bolt point down bendwise sinister Or; all within a narrow border Black.

Attached above the disc, a Buff scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "THE FEW SUPPORTING THE MANY" in Black letters.

Attached below the disc, a Buff scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "377TH MAINTENANCE SQ" in Black letters.

Significance. Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The scale on the shield is representative of the precision measurement equipment laboratory, as well as the internal balance between operations and maintenance within the unit. The clasps securing the Greek hoplite's (Spartan) cape represent the shell and flame symbolic of the munitions career field. The lightning bolt signifies the unit's support to the military community by its weather personnel. The chevron on the wrist guard is symbolic of intersecting runways, as well as the work airfield operations and transient alert perform maintaining the flight line.
