Blazon. On a disc Azure, a Zia sun symbol Gules throughout, bearing a bezant charged with a stylized Caduceus Argent; all within a narrow border Yellow.

Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "377 OMRS" in Yellow letters.

Significance. Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The Caduceus is a traditional symbol for medical care and reflects the Squadron's specialized skills in aerospace medicine. The Zia sun is a symbol for harmony and denotes the unit's involvement within its base and local community.
