Blazon. On a disc per fess Celeste and Or, between four triangles, one issuing from chief per pale of the second and Azure, one issuing from base counterchanged, two issuing from dexter and sinister fess, per fess of the second and of the third, points to centre, eight billet two in dexter chief, two in sinister chief of the second, two in dexter base and two in sinister base of the third, surmounted at centre a roundel per fess of the second and of the first, bearing a flight symbol in fess Gules, point to dexter, overall a silhouette of a security policeman holding a rifle of the third, within a circular chain of the third, centre of the links Scarlet; all within a narrow border Blue.

Attached above the disc, a Light Blue scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "PROVEN IN COMBAT" in Blue letters.

Attached below the disc, a Light Blue scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "377TH SECURITY FORCES SQ" in Blue letters.

Significance. Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The emblem as a whole depicts the unit's law enforcement and security functional areas, which are inseparable. The chain symbolizes encompassing security of personnel, aerospace resources (stylized aircraft), property and equipment. The twelve points of the outer edge represent the clock—24- hour protective coverage of aerospace vehicles and personnel. The four large points depict the directional points of the compass and the ability and willingness of Squadron personnel to deploy quickly to any global area in defense of the U.S. or oppressed people.
