Fellow Retirees,

I would like to introduce our two newest volunteers, Ricco Suarez and Woody Simpson.

Next, I want to commend Mark Werner, our 2024 Volunteer of the Year, for his service. We are blessed with a great team of volunteers to assist our military retiree/spouse community.

I wish to clarify information from the last edition of our newsletter where taxes and tax refunds were referenced. The information wasn't generally applicable to the retiree group and was confusing. Our Volunteer Income Tax Advisor provided the following information:

- First, the statement that state income tax refunds are taxable on the following year's federal return is true only for someone who itemizes deductions, instead of taking the standard deduction. The overwhelming majority of retirees take advantage of the standard deduction, so any state tax refund is not taxable to them. They may receive a Form 1099-G from the state, documenting the amount of the refund, but taxability is determined solely by the deduction method (standard or itemized) claimed by the retiree.
- Second is the discussion of the veterans' exemption bills. The newsletter stated,
 "This will be relevant for the taxes you file next year". These bills relate to
 PROPERTY, not income, taxes. So, they will be relevant to the property taxes
 PAID next year (2026), but not to next year's income tax filing.

Although we don't have a solid expiration date, you might want to get your new id card sooner rather than later.

We are in the process of planning a new seminar so stay tuned.

2025 KAFB Retiree Week

Mark Werner is the Kirtland RAO Volunteer of the Year

The Kirtland Retiree Activities Office recognized retired U.S. Air Force MSgt Mark Werner as the 2024 RAO Volunteer of the Year. Throughout the year, he volunteered more than 380 hours with the RAO. For example, Mark supported more than a dozen events during the 2024 Retiree Appreciation Week, helping ensure retirees were properly welcomed and informed. Why Do You Need the Latest and Greatest New Plastic-Based ID Card?

Because the old ID Card form (paper-based) will be invalid! Thus, while your benefits are for your lifetime, if you don't have the new ID card (plastic-based), you will not be able to access those benefits. That means, you will no longer have access things like to the base and the pharmacy. Also, you may no longer be registered in the DEERS System.

ID Card appointments may be made at https://idco.dmdc.osd.mil/idco. Additionally, the MPF has general walk-in hours for all customers needing CAC/DEERS assistance Monday – Friday, 0730-1200, except holidays, family days and training days.


There is also a dedicated "Retiree Day and Time" from 1100 – 1400 hours on the second Tuesday of each month. The next three dedicated days and times are 12 August 2025, 9 September 2025 and 14 October 2025, 1100 – 1400 hours. Retirees and their dependents <u>WILL</u> have priority. When you sign in at the kiosk, be sure to indicate that you are a retiree! <u>DO NOT</u> enter your rank on the next screen – just choose continue. (If you include your rank, the system will automatically shift you to an active duty member and you <u>WILL NOT</u> have priority in line.) While at MPF, you will also be able to ensure that your DEERS information is up to date. Volunteers from the RAO will be on hand to meet and greet retirees on these dedicated days.

<u>Note:</u> If you have an expired ID card, you will need to present a passport or real ID at the Truman Gate in order to get a temporary base pass. Tell them you are going to the MPF for the dedicated Retiree time to get a new ID card. Remember, you also need to show a valid vehicle registration and insurance card.

Self-service ways to get your new ID Card include: (for already established, valid ID cards only)

Order a new Retiree/Dependent ID online and have it mailed to you in 30 days. Go to https://idco.dmdc.osd.mil/idco and choose Family ID Cards. You must have a DS Logon or CAC card to do this. Plan ahead – this process takes 30 days to complete. Once the card is received, the sponsor must activate it online using the instructions included in the mailing. MOTE: If the ID card is not activated in a timely manner, it will automatically be terminated in DEERS.

ID Cards And DEERS • Use the kiosks located in the Consolidated Support Squadron lobby to order a new Retiree/Dependent ID and pick it up in about 2 weeks. You will need all required documentation, including 2 forms of unexpired ID and a signed DD Form 1172 (or the sponsor must attend for ID card pick-up). This process takes about 2 weeks to complete if all submitted documentation is correct. A system generated email will be sent if the application was accepted. Retirees will be contacted if their package is incorrect. You will be called or emailed when your ID card is ready.

Note: It doesn't matter if the old version of the ID card (Blue, Green or Pink) has an indefinite (INDEF) expiration date. You still need a new one!!!

Pharmacy Changes

The main pharmacy in the 377 Medical Group Clinic is open (see map below). All new scripts and any script your doctor sends to the KAFB Pharmacy are automatically sent to the clinic pharmacy and that is where you will pick them up. This change should be transparent to your doctor.

Please remember, electronic prescriptions will **NO LONGER** be automatically activated. If your doctor gives you a new electronic prescription, you must activate it in one of the following ways:

- If you have access, message the pharmacy on the MHS Genesis Patient Portal, https://patientportal.mhsgenesis.health.mil.
- Through the QR code found at the main clinic or the BX pharmacy.
- From a smart phone, <u>text</u> "Get in Line" to 1(833) 429-6533 and answering the tech's questions.
- If you do not have smart phone or text capability, you must go to the clinic pharmacy main window (pickup window) and take your turn in line to request activation. Then you can choose to wait or come back for your prescription. Let the pharmacy staff know what you plan to do.
- Note: there is a separate window for delivering paper scripts.

Your subsequent <u>refills</u> will be filled at the BX pharmacy and picked up at the BX pharmacy window or the kiosk (24/7). Request refills by:

- If you have a DS Logon, you can access the Kirtland Pharmacy through the MHS GENESIS Patient Portal at https://patientportal.mhsgenesis.health.mil. From there, you can send a message to the pharmacy requesting medication refills. Please include what medication(s) you would like refilled and whether you would like to pick them up at the Bx Pharmacy window or the Script Center in the BX.
- Alternatively, you can call (505) 594-2846 to use the automated phone line to request your prescription refills.

<u>Please note</u> that the official MHS GENESIS Patient Portal is accessible 24/7. If you find any websites that reference the MHS GENESIS Patient Portal or other information about MHS GENESIS that are not part of the <u>mil</u> domain, those are not official government websites or affiliated with the Department of Defense or Military Health System. For your cyber safety, only use official websites. If the **REAL ID** visitor's driver's license is not Real ID compliant, their second form of ID must be a current **Enforcement** passport or other form of Real ID. Albuquerque Area Free Senior Transportation Options

The city of Albuquerque has two different transportation programs available to those in the public that qualify, either through age or disability.

<u>Senior Affairs</u> – offers curb to curb transportation to adults 60 years and older. They provide rides by appointment 0730-1700, Monday – Friday, throughout the Albuquerque area for both medical and non-medical reasons. To get registered in the system, call Senior Affairs Transportation at (505) 764-6464. For medical appointments, a reservation must be made at least 7 days in advance. Once the appointment is complete, you must call for a ride home. For non-medical rides (grocery store, mall, etc.), a reservation must be made at least 3 days in advance. Transport will automatically return to pick you up 2 hours later.

<u>Albuquerque Sun Van (also referred to as ABQ Ride Para-Transit)</u> - Sun Van operates seven days a week, 365 days a year, Monday – Saturday, 0530 – 2200, and Sunday, 0600 – 1930. They provide transportation throughout Albuquerque and as far as Rust Medical Center in Rio Rancho. You must be "ADA paratransit eligible" to schedule a ride. Eligibility requirements include:

- Any individual who is unable, as the result of a physical, visual or mental impairment, to independently board, ride or disembark from any vehicle on the fixed-route system that is readily accessible to and unusable by individuals with disabilities.
- Any disabled person who could use accessible fixed-route transportation, but accessible transportation is not available at the time and on the route the customer needs.
- Any disabled person who has a specific impairment that prevents the person from traveling to or from a bus stop.

To verify eligibility, you must fill out an application and be interviewed at the Alvarado Transportation Center. Applications are available online at

https://www.cabq.gov/transit/services/paratransit-service/sun-van-application-for-paratransit-service or by calling (505) 243-7433. Once completed, it should be faxed to (505) 212-0131 or mailed to:

When ABQ RIDE receives the application, they will contact the applicant to set up an interview. If necessary, Sun Van can provide the applicant with a FREE ride to and from the interview. They will also provide instructions on how and when to schedule rides.

Rail Runner and Rio Metro Buses:

All military veterans and anyone with a federally issued veteran or military photo ID can ride the New Mexico Rail Runner Express and Rio Metro buses for free (must show a valid ID).

New 2025 Travel Requirements for Domestic and International Destinations Starting in May 2025, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security will require the use of Real ID for all domestic air travel. This may be a current state Real ID card, a valid REAL ID driver's license or a valid passport. A current passport is required for all international travel. Also, always check if a Visa is required for the country or countries you will be visiting. All U.S. and European travelers to the United Kingdom (England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland) are required to have an Electronic Travel Authorization (ETA) before arrival. The cost is about \$13.00 US and it is valid for multiple entries for 2 years. Apply for the ETA through the UK government's official website https://www.gov.uk/guidance/apply-for-an-electronic-travel-authorisation-eta or use the ETA app available from your App Store. Note: The European Union's European Travel Information and Authorization System (ETIAS) has been delayed until the 4th quarter of 2026. Stay tuned for more information as we get closer to the launch date.	2025 Travel Information
 Medicare Scams Are on the Rise It's important to know the signs of a Medicare scam so you can protect yourself. To get your personal information, like your Medicare number, scammers may call, text or email saying things like: "You need to activate or renew your Medicare card." "We'd like to send you a free genetic testing kit." "Medicare has authorized us to send you a free (knee, back or elbow) brace." "You qualify for a refund on your Medicare costs." "I'm from the Patient Advocacy Group. Did you receive the latest Medicare update that was sent to directly you a few weeks ago?" Medicare will never contact you unless you've contacted them first. Never give your Medicare card or number to anyone except your doctor or people you know should have it. Keep in mind: Caller IDs and email addresses can be faked, so if you're not sure who's calling, call Medicare directly at 1 (800) MEDICARE (1 (800) 633-4227). 	Recognizing Medicare Scams
New Mexico Motor Vehicle Department Scam There is currently a text message scam claiming to be from NM MVD (it usually says it's from NM DOT!) demanding payment for outstanding tickets. NM MVD WILL NOT contact any customer with threats or demand for payment. If you receive a scam message, please report it to MVD and DO NOT click on any links. MVD will only contact customers by mail with official letterhead. Anyone with questions about authenticity can contact MVD by calling 1-888-683-4636 or online at https://www.mvd.newmexico.gov/ for verification. Note: If you check the phone number or email address – in most cases, its coming from overseas. That's the first indication it's a scam! Do not click on any of the links – delete the message! VA Benefits for Elderly Veterans

Two VA programs provide certain elderly Veterans with an additional monetary amount if you are eligible for or receiving a VA Pension benefit.

Aid and Attendance (A&A) is an increased monthly pension amount paid if you meet one of the conditions below:

- You require help performing daily functions, which may include bathing, eating or dressing
- You are bedridden
- You are a patient in a nursing home
- Your eyesight is limited to a corrected 5/200 visual acuity or less in both eyes; or concentric contraction of the visual field to 5 degrees or less
- **Housebound** is an increased monthly pension amount paid if you are substantially confined to your immediate premises because of a permanent disability.

VA Health Care for Elderly Veterans

Geriatrics is health care for elderly Veterans with complex needs. Extended care - also known as long term care - is programs for Veterans of all ages who need daily support and assistance. Elderly Veterans can receive geriatric and long-term care programs at home, at VA medical centers, or in

the community.
