

Installation Commander's Directives update: <u>COVID-19 Return to Increment 3 (#044 – effective Feb. 8, 2021)</u> Adjustment to Personal Travel Policy (#044A – effective Feb. 11, 2021)

As of Mon., Feb. 8, 20201 - Health Protection Condition (HPCON) BRAVO+

PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY:

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 conditions on the installation and in the surrounding area, the base commander has extended the Declaration of a Public Health Emergency, dated March 13, 2020. This declaration renewal will terminate on **March 5, 2021.**

MASK WEAR:

In accordance with Secretary of Defense Directive (dated Feb. 4, 2021), effective immediately <u>ALL</u> individuals **MUST** wear masks continuously while on military installations. Mask wear is mandatory <u>regardless of vaccination status</u>, this includes any common area, open floorplan office spaces, cubicle embankments, conference rooms, and outdoor shared spaces. *Exceptions*:

- 1. When alone in an office with floor to ceiling walls with a closed door
- 2. For brief periods of time when eating or drinking while maintaining social distancing
- 3. When masks are required to be lowered briefly for identification or security purposes
- 4. When necessary to reasonably accommodate an individual with a disability
- 5. When vigorously exercising outdoors while maintaining social distancing
- 6. For all other situations outside of the office settings when temporary unmasking is necessary for mission requirement as approved by the Installation Commander. Submit exception request to the 377 ABW/CV.

Mask recommendations by the CDC include:

- A. Non-surgical disposable masks
- B. Masks made with breathable fabric such as cotton
- C. Masks made with tightly woven fabric
- D. Masks with 2 or 3 layers
- E. Masks with inner filters

Masks **NOT** authorized for wear:

- A. Novelty or non-protective masks
- B. Masks with ventilation valves
- C. Face shields (without protective mask)

GATHERINGS/EVENTS:

In accordance with Secretary of Defense Directive (dated Feb. 4, 2021), commanders are required to limit the number of persons in one room to permit social distancing guidelines of 6 feet and require cloth face coverings. Gatherings of more than 75 persons or 25% room capacity (whichever is smaller) are authorized **for official business only** when mitigating protocols are enforceable (social distance, face coverings, sanitization, etc.) Events not capable of executing the mitigating protocols require an Exception to Policy approved by the Installation Commander.



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PERSONNEL:

The installation has returned to Increment 3 levels (**75% of the workforce**). Commanders may return up to 75% of their workforce in shared workspaces and up to 100% for those performing duty in single occupancy areas. Commanders are encouraged to assess the risk and continue telework where required.

PERSONAL TRAVEL/LEAVE:

Note: All commercial travel, domestic and international, have a federal mandate to wear mask.

- 1. Upon return from leave, or personal travel, any individuals who show proof of COVID-19 vaccination and traveled outside the state of New Mexico may return to work without ROM with the approval of their Squadron Commander or equivalent. Note: Individuals are still required to comply with current New Mexico ROM policy for out of state travel when off installation.
- 2. Upon return from leave, or personal travel all persons that cannot show proof of COVID-19 vaccination will complete the Post-Travel Health Assessment using the 21 Aug 20 COVID-19 Risk Exposure Activities Worksheet. Persons that travel out of the State of New Mexico will undergo a 14-day ROM. Civilian employees are encouraged to telework during the ROM period when possible or work with leadership team to determine the appropriate absentee / purpose code.

Units may approve an exception to policy (ETP) to return a member to the workplace prior to the expiration of the 14-day ROM if deemed they are critical to the mission. All ETPs to curtail or forgo the 14-day ROM requirement must be approved by the **Squadron Commander or equivalent**.

- 3. Post-deployment ROM: Members will follow Department of the Air Force (DAF) Force Health Protection Guidance (FHPG) Addendum to FHPG, Supplement 9 and Department of Defense (DoD) FHPG Supplement 14:
 - Travel from a Foreign Country to the U.S.:
 All air passengers coming to the U.S. are required to have a negative COVID-19 test result or documentation of recovery from COVID-19 before they board a flight to the U.S.

VISITORS:

Visitors may be sponsored on base (via pass at the VCC). Visitors arriving at Kirtland AFB (regardless of mode or purpose of travel) from out of state <u>require</u> a 14-day ROM period upon arrival. Out of state visitors who show proof of COVID-19 vaccination should continue to exercise COVID protocols but may be exempt from ROM. *NOTE*: Individuals are still required to comply with current New Mexico ROM policy for out of state travel when off installation.



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MISSION ESSENTIAL OPERATIONS:

Mission essential service contractors supporting emergency work requirements on KAFB in response for life, safety, health, or loss of property may be exempt from ROM. The first O-6, GS-15, or equivalent in the chain of command may approve the emergency support exemption; however, the supporting contractor employer shall perform screening prior to personnel responding and performing service to ensure no COVID-like symptoms within the last 10 days, no member tested positive within the last 10 days, and no close contact with positive cases within the last 14 days.

BASE SERVICES:

Food:

- On base food services (concessionaires and food court) 25% indoor dining, 75% outdoor dining, and Take-out
- 2. DFAC 25% indoor dining and Take-out

Retail:

1. 50% capacity limits are imposed on Defense Commissary Agency facility, Base Exchange and Shoppettes.

Fitness Centers:

- East Side Fitness Center is open to all eligible patrons. Reserved for Active Duty Military personnel only until 10 a.m. Monday-Friday. Use the link https://kirtlandforcesupport.com/ for additional information, hours and limitations.
- West Side Fitness Center is open to all eligible patrons with proof of COVID-19
 vaccination. Use the link https://kirtlandforcesupport.com/ for additional information, hours, limitations and how to register for 24/7 access

Other (Limited) Services:

- 1. Auto Hobby self-serve & paid maintenance only (no classes)
- 2. Base Theater open for unit functions at 25% capacity. Use the link https://kirtlandforcesupport.com/ for additional information, hours and procedures
- 3. Bowling Alley open at 25% capacity and snack bar 25% indoor dining
- 4. Arts & Crafts open at 25% capacity and restricted class sizes
- 5. Aero Club Ground School, Instructor flights & training and Discovery Flights
- 6. Education Center Limited testing
- 7. Chapel ancillary programs cancelled (Religious Services will continue)
- 8. TMO (Household Goods/Passenger Travel) virtual support (in person by appointment only)
- 9. Ground Transportation Mission Essential support only
- 10. Communication Focal Point & COMSEC by appointment only
- 11. Golf Course 25% capacity (Snack Bar 25% indoor dining, 75% outdoor dining and take-out)



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- 12.ITT 25% capacity
- 13. Motor Vehicle Department (MVD) by appointment only
- 14. Indoor Pool Limited to AD only, 50% capacity. Use the link https://kirtlandforcesupport.com/ for additional information, hours and procedures
- 15. Mountain View Club open for meals to go, unit/special events with limitations; Bar/Restaurant open 25% indoor dining, 75% outdoor dining on Fridays, 4-8 p.m.
- 16. Outdoor Recreation All services open with limited trip size
