#### Medicare, Tricare And Covid Home Test Kits

Dear Fellow Retirees,

#### Free Covid Test Kits

Each U. S. household can order four free COVID-19 at-home tests shipped directly to their residential address. To order the tests, please **only** use the official, secure government website: <https://COVIDtests.gov>, the USPS website: <https://special.usps.com/testkits>, or call 1-800-232-0233. **BEWARE:** There is already a phone scam going around – if anyone calls asking for information so they can send you free test kits – **DO NOT GIVE THEM ANY PERSONAL INFORMATION. HANG UP!** It is a **SCAM!!!**

#### Medicare, Tricare and At-Home Covid Test Kits

Be aware that Medicare and Tricare will **NOT** cover the cost of at-home Covid Test Kits at this time. We’re sure you’ve heard that the federal government has made it mandatory for PRIVATE medical insurance companies to cover the cost of up to 8 at-home test kits per person, per month. However, Medicare and Tricare are **NOT** private insurances, therefore, they currently will **NOT** cover the cost of the at-home test kits. There is a plan for Medicare to start covering the kits later this spring, but a firm date has not been set yet. Make sure to order the 4 free Covid test kits per household that the government is currently offering so that you at least have them.

**Note:** Tricare is still not slated to cover the cost of these tests.

<p><b><u>Covid Testing in Albuquerque</u></b></p> <p>There are many places in the Albuquerque Metro area offering free Covid-19 Testing <b><u>by appointment</u></b>. These include CVS, Walgreens, Presbyterian Health Centers, NextCare clinics. There is a current list available at the NM Department of Health website <a href="https://cvprovider.nmhealth.org/directory.html">https://cvprovider.nmhealth.org/directory.html</a></p> <p>PCNM (Pathology Consultants of New Mexico, <a href="https://pcnm.com">https://pcnm.com</a>) offers drive-through Covid-19 Testing at 1635 University NE, Albuquerque, NM, <b><u>no appointment necessary</u></b>. Once you arrive, park in a designated parking spot and a laboratory professional will meet you at your vehicle. They are open Monday – Friday, 0730 – 16:30. Insurance is not necessary, but if you do have it, please bring your insurance card. For more information, text 575-622-5600.</p>	<p><b>COVID Testing</b></p>
<p><b><u>Protect Your Personal Information</u></b></p> <p>In addition to scammers calling you about free Covid home test kits just to get your personal information, there are many other scams out there. Your bank, your other financial institutions and the IRS will NOT call you requesting any personal information. If anyone calls you requesting this information – please <b><u>DO NOT GIVE IT TO THEM – HANG UP!</u></b></p> <p>Tax season is upon us. Please be careful with your mail, especially if it is delivered to an NBU (Neighborhood Box Unit). That’s the large multi-mailbox units for residential areas, apartment complexes, condo complexes, etc. Thieves are targeting these boxes in order to obtain your W-2’, tax returns and treasury checks. If your mail is delivered to one of these areas, please be sure to empty your box every day. Also, consider not putting out your outgoing mail until just before the mail carrier arrives.</p>	<p><b>Beware of Scammers And Thieves</b></p>

<p><b><u>Free National Park Passes</u></b></p> <p>The National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2022 was signed into law in December 2021. Effective immediately, all veterans and Gold Star Families now have <b>FREE</b> lifetime access to more than 2,000 federal recreation areas, including national parks, wildlife refuges, and forests. Free annual passes are also available for active - duty military personnel. Until the actual Lifetime Military Pass becomes available later this year, the free Interagency Annual Military Pass can be used. This pass can be obtained at any federal recreation site (<a href="http://www.nps.gov">www.nps.gov</a>). Albuquerque sites include: U.S. Forest Service, 333 Broadway Blvd. SE (505) 842-3292 Cibola National Forest and Grasslands Office, 2113 Osuna Rd. NE (505) 346-2650 Bureau of Land Management Office, 100 Sun Ave NE, Ste. 330 (505) 761-8700 Acceptable forms of eligibility include current DoD ID card, Veterans Health Identification Card, Veteran ID card, Veteran designation on state-issued driver’s license or ID card, or a Gold Star voucher. **Global Entry Information**

Global Entry is a US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) program that allows expedited clearance for pre-approved, low-risk travelers through customs ports of entry. It's the best program for frequent overseas travelers. For travel within the US, TSA Precheck (\$85 for 5 years) is the best. When entering overseas customs, Global Entry can save hours bypassing long lines. Clearly marked entry kiosks are set up in major airports and you just zip right through. Along with expedited entry into the US from overseas, the Global Entry program also gives you TSA-Precheck status for abbreviated security checks when departing on your travel. For Global Entry, you apply on-line and submit a non-refundable \$100 fee. Make sure you have key documents like passport and driver's license available. A CBP officer reviews your application and conducts a background check. If your application is approved, you're notified to schedule an interview with CBP personnel at the Albuquerque Sunport. It takes a while to get these interviews so make sure you plan ahead to allow for the interview and the receipt of the Global Entry card. Once you are approved, the Global Entry card is good for 5 years. You have to include the Global Entry numbers for all travelers when booking travel or you may not get TSA Pre-check. When renewing Global Entry, the application process is exactly the same. You can renew up to a year in advance and the 5 years is added on to your current membership period. Allow yourself plenty of time to get your interview scheduled. The Global Entry (and TSA Pre-check) website is <https://tsp.cbp.dhs.gov>.

**Information for Veterans and Caregivers**

All service-connected Veterans, Purple Heart recipients, Medal of Honor recipients, former POWs, and individuals approved and designated as primary family caregivers of eligible Veterans under the VA Program of Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers (PCAFC) can use commissaries, exchanges, and Morale, Welfare and Recreation (MWR) retail facilities, in-person and online.

Veterans must possess a Veteran Health Identification Card (VHIC) that displays "PURPLE HEART," "FORMER POW," or "SERVICE CONNECTED" below the photo on the front of the card. If a Veteran is not eligible to obtain a VHIC, the VA Health Eligibility Center Form H623A indicating placement in VA health care priority group 8E, paired with an acceptable credential, like a REAL ID-compliant driver's license or U.S. passport, will be accepted. For information on enrolling in VA health care, visit [www.va.gov/healthbenefits/enroll](http://www.va.gov/healthbenefits/enroll).

Eligible caregivers will receive an eligibility letter from VA's Office of Community Care. If you are a primary family caregiver under the PCAFC and lose your eligibility letter, please call 1-877-733-7927 to request a replacement. Please allow two weeks for processing.

**KAFB Base Access Policy**

Veterans must possess the above annotated VHIC. Then the Veteran should go to the KAFB Truman gate to have their VHIC card enrolled in the Defense Base Identification System (DBIDS). Once this is done, the authorized Veteran may escort one guest. In order to sponsor a guest, the Veteran needs to go to the Truman gate with their guest to obtain a pass, valid for up to 24 hours. Guests are not allowed to make purchases at the Base Exchange or the Commissary. Although visitor control is open 24 hours, it would be best to obtain the pass between core duty hours 0600 and 1500 hours.

- On 7 January 1941, construction began on the first buildings for an active military airfield on the East Mesa near Albuquerque and the Sandia Girls School, in order to house and provide a training environment for over 2,000 Airmen of the 19<sup>th</sup> Bombardment Group (Heavy), and its B-17 bombers. The 19 BG was commanded by Col. (later Maj Gen) Eugene L. Eubank, for whom Eubank Blvd is named.
- On 1 January 1993, Kirtland Air Force Base transferred to Air Force Material command, and the 377<sup>th</sup> Air Base Wing activated to assume host duties for the installation, taking over for the 542d Crew Training (later, 58<sup>th</sup> Special Operations) Wing.
